CALIFORNIA MEXICAN AMERICAN VETERANS MEMORIAL RECEIVES \$20,000 IN DONATIONS

Money To Be Used To Beautify and Enhance Memorial

The California Mexican American Veterans' Memorial has received two \$10,000 donations for beautifying and enhancing a state memorial that is rarely recognized or visited by the public at

the State Capitol in Sacramento. The Memorial commemorates the contribution of all Latino Veterans and has been described as a “homeless soldier” in need of major repair and enhancement. The donations from the Vanir Group of Companies, Inc. and the California Mexican-American Veterans Memorial, Inc. will be used to return to the citizens of California a historical commemoration first envisioned by mothers who raised funds and constructed a memorial to honor veterans following World War II.

“No public funds can be used to restore the memorial, thus we are grateful to the Vanir Group of Companies, Inc. and the California Mexican American Veterans Memorial, Inc. for their generous support,” said Robert J. Ruiz, Chair of the California Mexican American Veterans’ Memorial Beautification and Enhancement Committee. “These donations demonstrate the importance of community and private sector support of the goal to appropriately recognize the contributions of Latinos who have served in our Armed Forces since California entered the union in 1850.”
