## SAFETY RECOGNITION PROGRAMS

The Safety Recognition Programs of the Veteran of Foreign Wars continues to provide and promote programs designed to safeguard our communities. This long-standing commitment to safety has grown through the years to include every possible program or event associated with safeguarding people. Be creative and develop a safety activity and REPORT all accomplishments on the Program Reporting Form-12.

The six basic categories in the National Program are as follows:

1. **HIGHWAY SAFETY:** Any activity intended to improve individual driving skills and awareness or activities associated with improving safety on our roadways.
2. **PEDESTRIAN SAFETY:** Any worthwhile activity intended to improve individual awareness and visibility or non-motorized vehicle riding skills, awareness and responsibility.
3. **RECREATIONAL SAFETY:** Any organized activity associated with improving the skills and responsibilities of those individuals engage in a recreational activity.
4. **HOME/FIRE SAFETY:** Activities designed to promote and inform individuals within the community about protecting their homes, possessions and lives are reportable.
5. **DRUG AWARENESS:** Any program designed to inform and protect your community from the influence of substance abuse.
6. **RECOGNITION/OTHER:** A program to bring public recognition to the people of the community who spend their work day protecting lives and property. Recognizing the heroism/or safety achievements of individuals in the community. This category may be used to report an activity that does not fit any of the above categories.

Reportable activities include Disaster training, CPR/First Aid classes, providing assistance during a disaster, or setting up a disaster relief site equipped to house veterans and their families for at least a twenty-four (24) hour period in case of a major disaster.

## **HOW TO REPORT**

All activities should be reported on-line via the Department website under **Community Service or Safety Recognition** at <http://www.vfwca.org/membertools/programform12rpt.html> or by submitting a report (Form-12) to the Department Chairman.

**Important!** – To qualify for awards a Post must send a copy of the Program Reporting (Form-12) to the Department Chairman with all applicable attachments.

## **AWARDS**

Awards will be presented in both categories at the State Convention as follows unless otherwise noted elsewhere in this guide:

- 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> overall (Post & District) will be awarded a plaque, based on Chairman recommendation.
